

Five Important Security Strategies

Step One: DISSUADE

A well-planned security system will have devices that are plainly visible for the public to see. Cameras, sirens, warning signs are all put into place to discourage and dissuade individuals from committing a crime. Walk into any bank and see all cameras are very visible.

Our camera security trailers have 4 cameras and lights highly visible because they are on a 25 ft hydraulic mast. They come with a warning banner and signs that can be placed around a site. The siren and police style strobe lights are also very visible.



Step Two: DETECT

A well-planned security system will have devices that will detect verifiable motion that would indicate that an intruder is on site.

When a bank's security system is armed, the motion detectors seen and unseen are also turned on as a second line of defense.

Our camera security trailers have at least 5 infra-red motion detectors with built-in video verification cameras that we call electronic guards or E-Guards. When the security system is armed, they will report intrusions to our dispatch center and send pictures of what they are seeing on the site.



Step Three: DISPATCH

A well-planned security system will be monitored in a UL Grade A dispatch center. When a bank infra-red motion detector is activated, proper authorities are dispatched.

Cameras Security Trailers has a UL Grade A dispatch center that receives the alarm signal and video clip from our E-Guards providing proof that the protected site has a live intruder so that the proper authorities will respond.



Step Four: DETER

A well-planned security system will have devices that are designed to be loud and attract attention to deter theft and discourage the thief from staying on the site. These devices turn on immediately when the security devices are tripped. Banks typically have loud sirens or bells.



Step Five: DELAY

A well-planned security system will include methods of delaying a thief. Banks have highly secured vaults to delay criminal attempts giving time for police to arrive.
